## Summary

While most people turned their back on their neighbors, The Righteous Among the Nations helped rescue Jews and smuggle them over the border into Sweden. There were many ways to help. One way was to hide a Jew on your property. You could hide them up in your attic, or in a forest on your property if you had one. You could have them pose as your long lost relatives if you wanted to. Another way to help the resistance was to give out false papers. This would allow Jews to assume the identity of non-Jews. You could also help if you could smuggle Jews to Switzerland or other less dangerous countries.
